Founders' Prizes

Six prizes will be awarded by the Canadian History of Education Association (CHEA) at its 15th Biennial Conference on October 23-26, 2008 at the Radisson Hotel in Sudbury, Ontario.

Prizes acknowledge the excellence of contributions to educational history. The names of winners are published in *Historical Studies in Education/Revue d'histoire de l'éducation*.

Prizes are awarded in the following categories:

- an English-language article/original chapter
- a French-language article/original chapter
- an English-language book/anthology
- a French-language book/anthology

New for 2008:

- Theses prizes at the doctoral and masters levels written on the history of education in Canada, in either French or English

Eligibility requirements:

Works published by Canadian and international scholars in the field of Canadian educational history during the period between 1 May 2006 and 30 April 2008 are eligible for consideration. Doctoral or masters level theses must be written on the history of education in Canada and have been defended during the period between 1 May 2006 and 30 April 2008.

Deadline for Nominations: 30 April 2008

Nominations for all prizes, including self nominations, may be sent to the Canadian History of Education Association (CHEA), c/o Department of History, Laurentian University, 935 Ramsey Lake Road, Sudbury, Ontario, Canada, P3E 2C6. Please submit three copies of each nominated book, article or chapter. For doctoral or masters level theses prizes, please submit three copies of the thesis, along with a letter of presentation from the department chair or graduate chair.
